Class 1 & 2


This week we have continued with our theme 'The Seaside'. We had a visit from Jack's dad who came to tell us about his job in the community; sourcing crabs, lobsters and other sea creatures. The children learnt lots of interesting facts and asked respectful questions.

In the outdoor area the children were challenged to make boats using junk modelling materials and test them out in the water tray to see if they would float or sink. We learnt some new vocabulary including; density, particles and buoyancy. The children had to think carefully about which materials to use and what would happen when they tested it out.

In Year 3 this week, we have been continuing with our plant experiment and finding out if the number of seeds within one plant pot affects the growth of the plant. In the pots we have 2 seeds, 4 seeds, 8 seeds, 16 seeds and 32 seeds. The children have been so intrigued to find out the results. As you can see, the pots containing more seeds aren't looking very healthy and have started to droop.

In Design and Technology, we have completed our final designs and produced our puppet prototypes. The children have used their market research (from EYFS) to help them design a puppet which is suitable for a young audience. Next week, we will be practising a running and overcast stitch.
