EYFS

Class 1 & 2

This week the children have created some art based on the artist Karen Lederer. The children used techniques such as sketching, painting and printing to recreate her famous painting of a fruit bowl. The gallery wall in EYFS now looks beautiful. Maybe your child can tell you a fact about Karen?

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Year 1

Class 3 & 4

This week our unit of learning in maths has been money.

Year 2

Class 5 & 6

This week in Year 2 we have continued learning about statistics in maths. In English we have been reading Grandad's Camper and using it to write a sequel to the story.

This week we have completed our focus reading text, which was 'The Tunnel' by Anthony Browne. The children have been amazing at learning the new fluency strategies, discussing vocabulary and sharing their thoughts on the text and characters.

In PSHE we have been creating memory books about our time in Year 2. In Design Technology we have evaluated our coleslaw and sandwiches from last week.

We have started our last PE unit of the year which is based on team building and problem solving.



Year 3

Class 7 & 8

In Year 3, we have been practising our sewing skills in preparation for making our puppets next week. We have learnt how to use a running stitch and an overcast stitch.

In Science, we have been experimenting which surface creates the most friction. We were able to conclude that smooth surfaces create less friction than a bumpy surface.

The children have been enjoying reading the book, This Morning I Met a Whale, by Michael Morpurgo. As well as exploring the character's emotions, they have been practising their fluency strategies.







Year 4

Class 9 & 10

The children have enjoyed learning about coordinates this week in Maths and have started planning a spooky narrative. In science, we are learning about food chains.

The children have been learning about using commercial colour charts, to decide colours, tones and shades inspired by our work on Frieda Kahlo.

In PE we have been learning about long jump and throwing javelin.



Year 5



In writing this week we have been beginning to explore how we can create suspense in a story setting, looking at what tools we could use to create a tense atmosphere for our reader. We have really been thinking about our word choices and how these can help create a mood.

Year 5 have also continued to work hard within their teams, problem solving and compromising to create a final game for our 'mini summer fair'. They have worked so well together and as staff we are so proud of what they put together today. Their stalls were brilliant!

Next week, we hope to be able to announce how much money that they have raised for the friends of the school.





Class 13 & 14

Year 6 are enjoying their last couple of weeks at primary school. The play has been a huge focus so that children are ready to perform their socks off on Monday 15th July. Thank you for all the work that has gone into preparing costumes for this and helping children learn lines.
