We have also been learning about the importance of brushing our teeth. The children have enjoyed roleplaying as dentists and patients. Again, we have discussed the importance of taking turns with the resources and what we might have to say to one another to act out the scenario.

In P.E. The children have been continuing to develop their football skills, focusing on how we can find space, defend and control the ball effectively.







This week, Year 6 have finished writing some great innovations on, 'Defeating the Monster.' They have gathered lots of fabulous ideas to create suspense and show their character is scared. They applied some of their learning when writing short stories that showed a change in mood and atmosphere.

The children have connected to their previous learning in Geography around countries and capital cities and researched the climate and biomes of Russia and started to compare this to Antarctica.





In History, they have discussed bias and omission of historical sources and what sort of primary sources may have been around during the reign of Lady Jane Grey in the 1500s. (We discovered that cameras were definitely not in use back then!)
