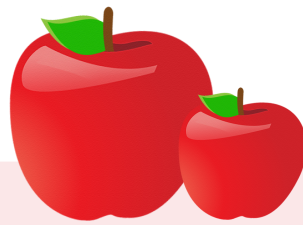

## Class 0C & 0S

This week we have enjoyed baking apple crumble with the apples collected from the school orchard.

The children have also enjoyed some new additions to our indoor and outdoor building areas. We have been using Mobilo to create amazing models inside and tarpaulin and poles to make dens outside. It's been lovely to see the children trying lots of new things this week.

In maths we have been learning about numbers 1, 2 and 3. We have been doing lots of work to recognise these numbers, subitise them and make different representations of them.

## Year 1

### Class 1A & 1S

This week we have been putting everything we have learned in writing into practice and writing our own stories all by ourselves! Mrs Allenby and Miss Scuffham were so proud of us. Some of us even remembered to use a simile, wow!

In art we continued our learning about collage and learned about layering. We created some super pictures of the field area selecting materials carefully.

In music we have been listening to and learning some rap music. Our song is called Hey You! and we have been learning to play part of it on the recorder. We are now able to play C and G.



## Class 2S & 2MT

It's been another busy week in Year 2! In music we have continued learning the notes to 'hands, feet and heart' on the recorders. If you have a recorder at home, see if your child can remember the tune!

We really enjoyed completing our collages in art this week. We worked really well in small groups, practiced the techniques we have learnt (such as crumpling, overlapping, overlaying) and we are all really proud of our final creations of The Shard.

In geography we have been learning about landmarks and recognising famous landmarks in London such as the Houses of Parliament, Big Ben, the London Eye and Tower Bridge.

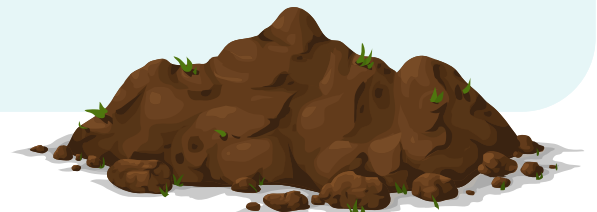


## Class 3C & 3WR

This week in history, the children have been learning about Stone Age settlements. The children should be able to tell you all about Skara Brae (a Stone Age settlement that was discovered by William Watt on the island of Orkney). The posters they created in our lessons contained lots of interesting facts ranging from what the settlements were built out of, to the types of things that were found inside.

In maths, the children have been working well do develop their written calculation methods for subtraction.

In science, the children have been making observations of different soil types. We learnt that soil is made from rock that has eroded, organic matter, air and water.



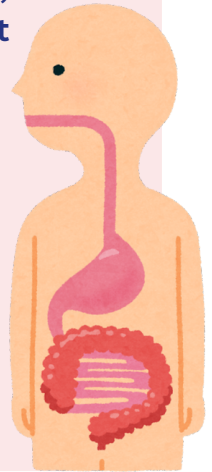


## Class 4S & 4M

This week Year 4 have finally completed our innovated warning stories. We can't wait to plan and write another one in our 'hot write' next week. In maths, we have focussed on problem solving and in reading Edward (now known as Jangles) has experienced losing someone dear to him. We have discussed, how his character has changed through his experiences and read all about Memphis, his next location on his journey.



We have been continuing to learn about the body, in particular 'digestion' this week in science. We used tights and mashed food to simulate the digestion process. We have also talked about what happens to the waste products that our body no longer needs.



# Year 5

## Class 5G & 5BT

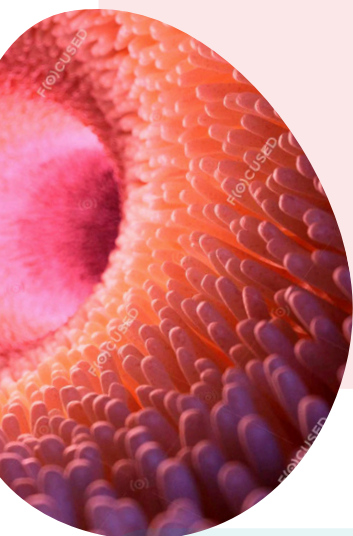
We have had a busy week in year 5 this week! The children have continued to read Street Child, and have also read a diary extract about a child who escaped a workhouse. We made comparisons between Jim and the author of the diary, and also contrasted their experiences. While reading Street Child, the children examined what they learned about events and characters through dialogue, and the comments were very insightful and detailed. In maths, we have learned about cubed numbers and multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000. We have also done our first application lesson - we learned to apply our learning about factors and multiples to challenging tasks, and the children loved it!

We have also written our "hot" independent task. The children used everything they have learned to complete this and produced entertaining portal stories! Well done for all your hard work! Finally, we learned about European capital cities and what we can learn from maps and atlases in geography - give your children a quiz at their capital cities! They blew the year 5 staff away with their knowledge!

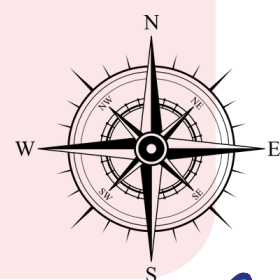


## Class 6BA & 6BL

The children in Year 6 have been as busy as ever with their learning. They have used ReadingPlus for the first time to test their reading fluency and enjoyed exploring the website. Logins have been sent home in Reading Records and children are welcome to access this from home. From next half term, homework will be set on ReadingPlus also. It is great to see so many children using their Reading Records already - we hope to see this continue!



They explored how water and nutrients are transported in Science (ask them if they can remember what is pictured on the left) and what different map symbols tell them about Antarctica in Geography. In English, they have been continuing with their hot writes on 'Defeating a Monster.' They have been working hard to apply all of their learning on suspense and mystery to create some exciting reads!

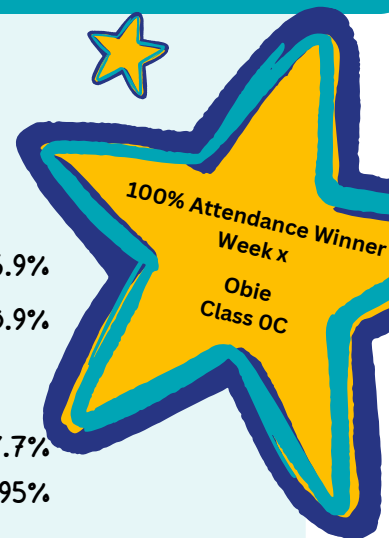
