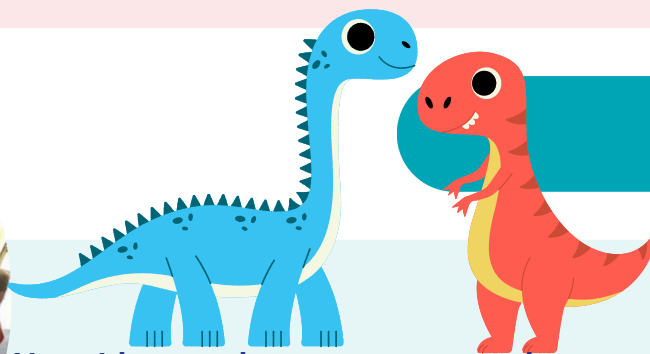
## Class 0C & 0S

This week we had a visit from the Gingerbread Man and his friends. We saw a video of them in our classroom and hunted for them all week. The children made traps, catchers, posters and maps to try and find them! This kickstarted our new Talk for Writing Text 'The Gingerbread Man.' We have started our new story map and can't wait to bake gingerbread men next week.

We also explored ice outside. With the sudden drop in temperature, please make sure your child has hats, gloves, scarves and appropriate footwear to be able to access outdoor provision comfortably.

In maths we have continued exploring numbers within 5 and found out that smaller numbers can make bigger numbers e.g. 4 and 1 makes 5.

In phonics we learnt the digraph 'oo'.



## Year 1

## Class 1A & 1S

Year 1 has made a great start to the new year!

In Science we have started a new unit all about the body. The children have been identifying body parts such as the elbow, shoulder, legs and arms using a life size body template to identify where they go.

During History the children have been looking at dinosaurs and discovering when they became extinct. The children have enjoyed drawing their own version of a dinosaur and labelling different features.

This week in phonics we have been reviewing different digraphs that we learnt during last half term.

In English the children have been looking at verbs and adverbs to make their writing more descriptive. Year 1 have undertaken a verb hunt in which they had to search for different verbs in the classroom.





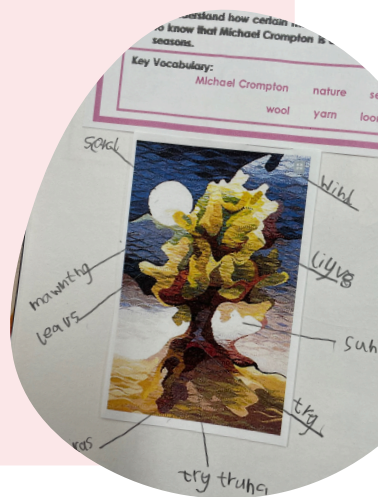
## Class 2S & 2MT

Year 2 have returned to school full of excitement and enthusiasm for the new term. We are excited to begin our new unit of gymnastics in PE. In Art, we are learning about weaving, and in history we are learning about castles.

Our hook in writing this term has been magical and sparkly as we begin our unit on Peter Pan with Tinkerbell leaving behind a trail of glitter in our classrooms! We created our own spine poems and explored the fantasy worlds of Narnia and an under water magic forest.

In Maths, we are beginning to learn about fractions, and have so far, learnt about parts, wholes, equal and unequal parts and finding a half.

2S brought their teddies in to school on Thursday as a treat for another full set of letters for whole class attendance, we had a super cosy afternoon with them and wore our slippers all day!



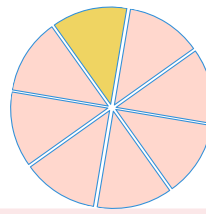
## Class 3C & 3WR

It has been wonderful to welcome the children back to school this week! We have been so excited to see everyone, and it's been amazing to share their enthusiasm for the new learning ahead this term.

This week, we started reading our new class book, *The Firework-Maker's Daughter* by Philip Pullman. The children were really engaged in the story, and we used our prediction skills to guess what might happen next. It was great to hear everyone's fantastic ideas about the characters and what could be coming in the story.

In English lessons, we have been focusing on poetry. The children wrote beautiful acrostic poems about flowers. They worked very hard to choose the best words to describe the flowers and even used personification—giving human qualities to the flowers! The poems are full of creativity, and the children did a wonderful job of bringing their ideas to life through words.





## Class 4S & 4M

We hope that everyone has enjoyed a little break from school and is well rested ahead of a busy Spring term. This half term, we are looking forward to writing a portal story in English, learning about fractions in maths and reading our new book, 'The Iron Man' in reading. We also have Dallowgill to look forward to in just a few weeks time. All forms should now have been returned to school.



We are beginning lots of new topics this half term: our first geography unit this year will be looking at Greece and its biomes. In Science, we are studying states of matter. In PE, we will be working on levels and direction in a gymnastic based topic. In RE, our learning moves on to faith. In ICT, we will be studying photo editing. In music, we are focusing on jazz music. In French, we will be learning about animals.

Happy New Year and welcome back! And what a first week back the children have had - it is as if they have not just come back from a two week break. Their attitude and enthusiasm have been outstanding, and the effort shown this week towards their learning has been excellent. We have started our new text for this term: The Boy at the back of the Class. The children are already really excited to read this book based on the comments we have heard in class. In writing, we have started our new unit of work, which will be a suspense piece. 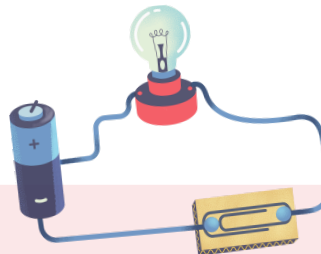
