Class OC & OS

This week we have created sculptures inspired by Barbara Hepworth. We found out that her sculptures have holes. We recreated this using junk modelling. Next week we will use clay to create sculptures.

We have continued to re-tell The Gingerbread Man and will begin to innovate the story next week to create our own characters and setting. The children have enjoyed making 'bridges' outside to help the gingerbread man cross the river safely.

In phonics we learnt the following digraphs and trigraphs; ow, oi, ear and air.

In maths we have been exploring numbers 6, 7 and 8. We talked about one more, one less and the composition of each number.

Year 1

Class 1A & 1S

In PSHCE this week, the children have been looking at working with a partner. We tried a game where the children had to 'mirror' the other child. The children really had to look closely at what their partner was doing in order for the mirroring to work! We have also looked at what we would like to improve on in our everyday life and what they will do to achieve their goal.

In Maths, we have been looking at grouping tens and ones. The children have found this challenging but fun and have been using base tens to help them in their work.

In phonics, we have been looking at the alternative sounds such as oa (o, o, a), oo (u, (y)oo, u), c (ch, sh, ch) and e (ee).









Class 25 & 2MT

This week we have really enjoyed exploring our new gymnastics unit in PE and have shown control when working on side rolls, forwards rolls and teddy bear rolls - some of us demonstrated a new skill for the first time!

In maths we continued our work on fractions and have been recognising a half, a quarter and a third. In computing we enjoyed giving directions and instructions for the beebots to follow. We worked really well collaboratively!


We have learnt some new warm up exercises and games in music which has been so much fun! This week we also explored different instruments and listened to some country music.

In writing we have been using "sentences of 3' adjectives to describe a character and used subordinating conjunctions to add extra information. We have also planned our own fantasy stories which we will finish next week.





Year 3





Class 3C & 3WR

This week in Science, we have been using lux meters to test and measure different levels of light. We explored how various materials behave when light passes through them, and we categorised them into three types: opaque, transparent, and translucent. This investigation helped us understand how light interacts with different surfaces and materials. Additionally, we have been learning important tips on how to stay safe in the sun, including the need for sunscreen, hats, and proper clothing.

In Writing, we have been focusing on describing settings for a quest story. The children have worked on using their imagination. Soon, they will begin writing their own quest stories, applying their newly learned vocabulary and ideas to make their narratives come to life.

In Design and Technology we have been learning about circuits and the different components needed to make a bulb light up. The children thoroughly enjoyed exploring how to make the bulb light up.

A weekly spelling homework has been set on Emile. The children have one week to complete this task and should practise spelling the words correctly in different contexts.





Class 45 & 4M

We have been inspired this week by Harry Potter and Tom Riddle's diary. We have written our own portal stories, using a book as the portal. Our ideas have been so imaginative. In reading, we have been learning more about the Iron Man, even reading a text learning all about Iron, Steel and Aluminium. In maths, we have been subtracting fractions. This has ben tricky but we have persevered and experience lots of success.



In PE, we have loved getting the equipment out and exploring how we can create levels in our gymnastic routines.

4S have enjoyed their first attendance reward this week. Waiting an extra week for our McFlurry's made them taste even more delicious. 4S are also enjoying having Toffee (the attendance owl) in our classroom this week. Well done 4S! 4M came a close second too. Well done 4M!

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Year 5



In Maths this week, we have been learning how to represent fractions as decimals. The children have done really well with this, especially as we introduced thousandths and tried to trick them with questions where they had to use 0 as a place holder. Many of them completed the silver and gold challenges this week! Fantastic effort!

In Science we have been learning about the Moon, its phases and how craters have been formed on it. We did our own investigation, where we tried to recreate objects hitting the Moon's surface and recorded the depth and length of each crater. The children did ask for a field trip to the Moon but we didn't think the risk assessments would pass!

We are really enjoying reading The Boy at the Back of the Class. We have learnt a lot about refugees and have been practising summarising the main ideas in a chapter or paragraph.

Our suspense writing is coming along nicely and we are looking forward to writing our innovations based on The Nightmare Man.

Keep up the good work Year 5!








Class 6BA & 6BL
