## Class OC & OS


This week we have enjoyed practising lots of different skills in busy time. We used thinner paintbrushes to paint detailed tulips and talked about the parts of a plant. We observed the beans we planted last week and kept checking for a shoot. We also threaded hessian with a needle and thread and had fun with the parachute!

In maths we have discussed the properties of 3D shapes. The children enjoyed further exploring 3D shapes in busy time. We found out some shapes are good for rolling and some shapes are better for stacking. Some children then challenged themselves to create a 'bowling alley' to test out the spheres outside and stacked the blocks to re-create Scarborough Castle.

Next week we will assess the children in phonics to find out their success' and next steps. They will then receive a book matched to their current phonics ability.

## Class 1A & 15

This has seen the children finish learning about non-fiction texts in English as they did their 'hot write'. The children chose to writ about their teacher, the Gruffalo or Paddington Bear. They remembered to split their writing into sections and were all really proud when they used conjunctions in their work. We are continuing to work on our handwriting.

In maths our learning has moved on to identifying and learning about 2D and 3D shapes. We used plasticine to make different 3D shapes with all the right properties. Can you find any 3D objects around your house?

In science we have moved from naming the parts of a tree to naming parts of a flower. We enjoyed being scientists when we cut up plants to identify the different parts and what they are for.







### Class 25 & 2MT


What a busy week in Year 2! In maths we have started a new unit on position and direction and focused on the vocabulary 'left, right, above, below, between'.

At the end of the week 2S enjoyed reading for pleasure outside in the sunshine! And we all loved being able to get outside for PE.








Year 3




In science, we have been exploring why some plants have flowers. The children did an excellent job labelling the different reproductive parts of a plant and learned all about which animals help with pollination.
